Karrer Medal 2009

The University of Zurich and the Paul Karrer Foundation are proud to announce that **Prof. Akira Suzuki**, Hokkaido University, is the 50th Paul Karrer Medalist. The medal is given in recognition of Professor Suzuki's contributions to the reactivity of boron reagents and palladium catalysts culminating in exceptionally useful methods for the development of novel nanomaterials and biologically active agents.

The Werner Prize 2009, awarded to a promising young scientist for outstanding independent chemical research, was awarded to **Prof. Roland K.O. Sigel**, Institute of Inorganic Chemistry, University of Zurich.

The Dr. Max Lüthi Award was awarded to **Simon Lang**, University of Applied Sciences Northwestern Switzerland, for his excellent diploma work 'Immunosuppressive Drugs and their Interaction with the Efflux Transporter P-Glycoprotein'.

Both prizes will be conferred at the next SCS Fall Meeting at EPFL in Lausanne.

The Sandmeyer Prize 2009 was awarded to a research team from EMPA at the recent SCS Spring Meeting. The prize winners are **Dr. Norbert Heeb**, **Dr. Andrea Ulrich** and **Dr. Lukas Emmenegger**.
