Editorial

After the wealth of activities during the International Year of Chemistry 2011 it was a challenge to keep the momentum alive and further strengthen the Swiss Chemical Society (SCS). At the forefront are the SCS' endeavors to maintain public awareness of chemistry's contributions to society, of the challenges ahead, chemistry's role in their resolution, and the SCS' efforts to stay abreast of the developments in new areas in the field.

The Board discussed the SCS' strengths and weaknesses in January 2012 and this led to a re-definition of the Society's mission statement and the strategies on how to achieve the goals. Three additional members were elected to the Board to broaden its fields of activity and to help in the implementation of the decisions. First tangible results include:

- A closer collaboration with KGF (Kontaktgruppe für Forschungsfragen) and the establishment of a new award program (KGF-SCS Industrial Science Awards).
 - A new concept for the Freiburger Symposium (Division of Industrial & Applied Chemistry).
 - A new SCS webpage.
- Other projects are in the process of elaboration.

Of existing activities we highlight just a few:

- Organization and/or sponsorship of public and scientific meetings.
- Organization of forty educational courses (Division of Analytical Chemistry)
- Collaboration with the Platform Chemistry of SCNAT, Swiss Science Industries (SGCI), and the European Association for Chemical and Molecular Sciences (EuChemS)
- Presentation of six SCS awards to scientists.

These and others, as detailed in the report, kept us very busy in 2012.

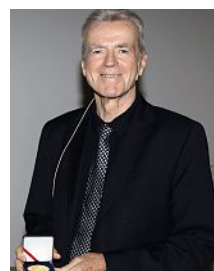

Paracelsus Prize



CHF 20,000 and medal in gold; awarded to an internationally outstanding scientist for his or her lifetime achievements in chemical research.

Prof. **Bernd Giese**, University of Fribourg and Basel, in recognition of his pioneering work on stereoselective radical reactions in synthesis and his elaboration of the mechanism of electron transfer processes in biopolymers. Ceremony and lecture at the Fall Meeting in Zurich, Sep 13, 2012.

Werner Prize



CHF 10,000 and medal in bronze; awarded to a promising young scientist for outstanding independent chemical research.

Prof. **Nicolai Cramer**, EPFL Lausanne, in recognition of his pioneering studies in metal catalyzed C–C and C–H activation reactions and their application in organic synthesis. Ceremony and lecture at the Spring Meeting in Geneva, Apr 16, 2012.

Grammaticakis-Neumann Prize

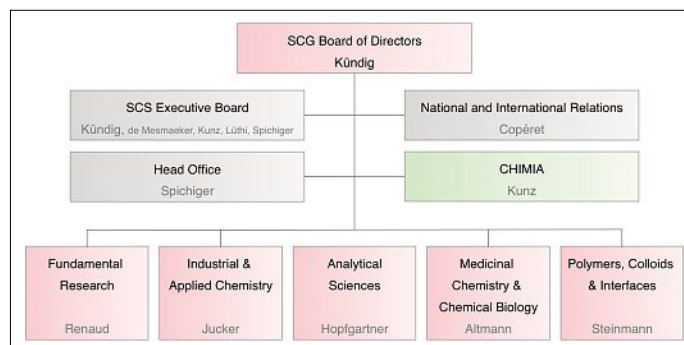

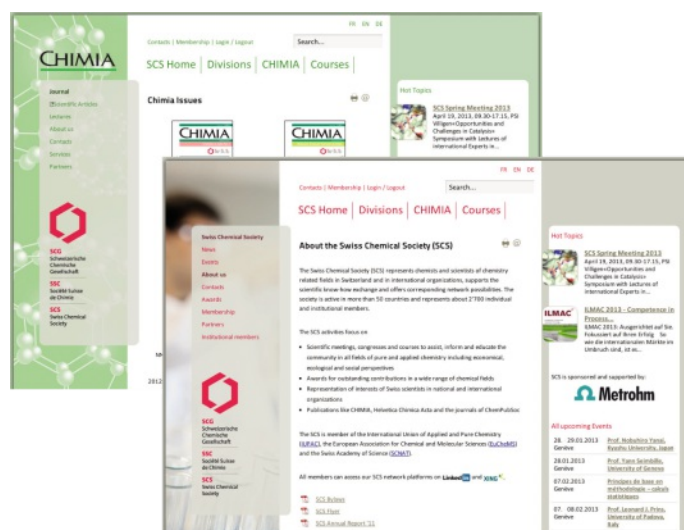

CHIMIA is now using 'CrossCheck powered by iThenticate', a *CrossRef* service to its members. The use of this software will allow easy detection of plagiarism, an intellectual misconduct that cannot be tolerated by any scientific journal.

By the end of 2012 Prof. Karl Gademann stepped down from his duties as the contact person to CHIMIA's Advisory Board. He had joined the EB in 2007 – thank you for your service. Around 1800 chemists from 57 countries around the world congregated on Prague for the 4th EuCheMS Chemistry Congress from 26 to 30 August. The diverse and star-studded programme featured nine plenary speakers, among whom Nobel laureates held a narrow majority. In between there were 12 parallel sessions ranging from traditional disciplines like organic synthesis and inorganic materials to adjacent fields including life sciences and the history of chemistry.

SCS Fall Meeting 2013



Hans Peter Lüthi organized the SCS Fall Meeting on September 13, 2012 at the ETH Zürich. With more than 600 scientific contributions and 800 participants, the meeting confirmed its popularity within the community of chemists in Switzerland. Nine parallel sessions were held in the following fields

- Analytical chemistry
- Medicinal chemistry
- Computational chemistry
- Inorganic and coordination chemistry
- Organic chemistry
- Physical chemistry
- Polymer science
- Catalysis science



For the first time, a session dedicated to Catalysis Science and Engineering was organized and proved very successful with more than 80 contributions.

A good combination of invited lectures, oral and poster presentations kept the participants busy during the whole day. The Dr. Max Lüthi Award was presented to Lucie Sägerser from ZHAW and the Grammaticakis-Neumann Prize was awarded to Hans Jakob Wörner from ETH Zurich. Prof. Bernd Giese from University of Fribourg and Basel received the Paracelsus Prize and gave the final lecture of the day.

As usual, junior scientists attributed importance input with their oral and poster presentations. The best presentations in the different fields were awarded the SCS–Metrohm Prizes (best oral presentations, 18 awards) and SCS–DSM Prizes (best poster presentations, 27 awards). The awarded research works will be presented in a special issue of CHIMIA (April 2013) dedicated to the SCS-laureates and awards.

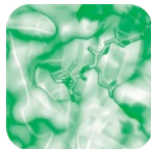

KGF-SCS Industrial Science Awards 2013

Four scientists are awarded with the KGF-SCS Industrial Science Awards 2013 in recognition of their pioneering scientific contributions to the Swiss chemistry and pharmaceutical industry. The awards with prize sums of CHF 15'000, 10'000 and 7'000 are given for the first time in 2013. The main award goes to Prof. Dr. Klaus Müller from F. Hoffmann La-Roche Ltd.



Prof. Dr. **Klaus Müller** (picture) is awarded with the KGF-SCS Distinguished Industrial Investigator Award and a prize sum of CHF 15'000 for pioneering a number of important and crucial scientific initiatives both in academia and industry and most importantly for his early pioneering in ensuring quality academic-industry relations.

After his habilitation at ETH Zurich in 1977, Klaus Müller worked at the Department of Organic Chemistry at ETH before he joined Roche in 1982. Amongst others he was a Member of the Board and Secretary-General of The Roche Research Foundation. Since his retirement in 2009 he is working as an internal consultant with Roche and as lecturer at the ETH Zurich.

The KGF-SCS Senior Industrial Investigator Award, with a prize sum of CHF 10'000, is awarded to Dr. **Werner Bonrath** and Dr. **Ian Lewis**. Dr. Werner Bonrath works with DSM Nutritional Products in Basel is awarded for his contributions in the fields of vitamins, carotenoids and flavor and fragrances, always related to the application of new catalytic processes that can be industrialized. Dr. Ian Lewis, working at Global Discovery Chemistry, Novartis Institutes of Biomedical Research in Basel, is awarded in recognition for the design and synthesis of SOM230 – Pasireotide (Signifor®) as the first pituitary directed medical therapy for Cushing's disease approved by EMEA in 2012.

The prize of CHF 7,000 accompanying the KGF SCS Industrial Investigator Award is presented to Dr. **Mark Rogers-**

Evans, from Roche Basel for his work in medicinal chemistry, particularly for his studies of small heterocyclic ring systems such as oxetanes and azaspiro[3.4]octanes.

The prize ceremonies will take place at the SCS VIP dinner in Lausanne on September 5, 2013. All prizewinners will present their work at the Swiss Chemical Society's Fall Meeting on September 6, 2013, in one of the parallel session or in the plenary session.
