

WELCOME TO THE 2019 FALL MEETING OF THE SWISS CHEMICAL SOCIETY (SCS)

On behalf of the Organizing Committee and the Division of Fundamental Research of the Swiss Chemical Society, we welcome you to the 2019 Fall Meeting, hosted jointly by the ETH Zürich and the University of Zürich Departments of Chemistry. A special welcome goes to the presenters of the well over 500 scientific contributions (posters, contributed lectures, invited and award lectures). As in 2016, when the Fall Meeting also took place on Irchel Campus, teachers of chemistry attending the symposium 'Future of Chemical Education' will join us. Being part of the Fall Meeting, the symposium will help build bridges between research and education.

This year's Fall Meeting scientific program will open with the Sandmeyer and SCS Industrial Science Award lectures. The Sandmeyer Award honors teams of researchers for their achievements in the field of industrial or applied chemistry, whereas the SCS Industrial Science Award honors researchers from industry for an outstanding achievement.

As in previous years, we will have eight thematic parallel sessions, most of them with an invited lecture, a lecture presented by a researcher of the sponsoring company, plus ten oral communications by students. For the first time, each session has a sponsor ('endowment'), which shows the great appreciation of the chemical and pharmaceutical industry for the research performed by the young generation of chemists.

During the extended lunch break, the Commercial Exhibition, with twenty companies presenting their products and services, will be worth a visit. At the same time, there will be the Poster Session.

After the afternoon parallel sessions, the Grammaticakis-Neumann and Senior Industrial Science Award Lectures will be presented. These prizes are for a promising young scientist for outstanding accomplishments in the field of experimental or theoretical photochemistry, and for an industrial investigator for his or her long-term research achievements.

The meeting ends with award ceremonies, where the best oral and poster contributions are being honored. Forty prizes worth 42,750 CHF (!) will be handed out to their winners, turning the finale of the Fall Meeting a big spectacle.

We invite you to browse through the program and hope that the 2019 Fall Meeting will capture your interest. Your participation and your contribution to the scientific discussion will help to make the event a success for everybody involved.

We look forward to seeing you on Friday, September 6 at the University of Zürich Irchel Campus!


CONFERENCE VENUE AT IRCHEL CAMPUS, UNIVERSITY OF ZÜRICH
